Students will be prepared to compete in competitions throughout Central Florida including MathLeague, Math Olympiads, Mu Alpha Theta, AMC, and MATHCOUNTS. Students who are part of this rigorous team must attend practices on Mondays until 3:30 and Fridays until 5 pm. Students must be part of the elective as well. Those who want to join the team but not the elective must have approval. Students who join should be prepared for math enrichment, teamwork development, and learning how to use problem-solving in new and challenging ways.

# Elementary Science Olympiad 

 Coaches: Mr. Barut \& Mrs. Powell Wednesdays and Fridays Grades 3, 4, \& $5 \quad \$ 60$ FeeElementary Science Olympiad (ESO) is a club for students in grades $3-5$ who are interested in science. The club meets twice a week after school to participate in a variety of hands-on science activities. These activities are designed to teach students about different scientific concepts and to help them develop their problem-solving skills. In addition to the weekly meetings, the ESO club also competes in local and regional science competitions. These competitions give students the opportunity to test their skills against other students from around the area. The ESO club is a great way for students to learn about science, to develop their problemsolving skills, and to meet other students who share their interests. If you are a student in grades 3-5 who is interested in science, then you should consider joining the ESO club. Here are some of the benefits of participating in Elementary Science Olympiad: Learn about different scientific concepts and principles, develop problem-solving skills, meet other students who share your interests, compete in science competitions, and have fun! Students must be present for this group two days a week and/or every other Saturday, for a total of about 4-7 hours a week outside of regular class hours. I strongly advise all parents and students to view this like any other competitive team, even though coaches won't require a student to attend every competition and practice.

THIS IS A TRYOUT BASED CLUB. We will have tryouts at the beginning of the year and a roster will be announced. This is a competitive basketball club for players planning on trying out for the basketball team. Students who are new to basketball are encouraged to sign up for the Intermediate Basketball Club. This club will be one hour long, twice a week (Tuesday and Thursday). We will work on fundamental skills, but we will do a lot of scrimmaging, so it is essential that players possess the skills to at least be able to scrimmage from an early point in the year.

You will use the Google form link sent via email to request your child's clubs.

## Things to keep in mind when requesting clubs:

1. Choose your favorite, absolute must have club as your first choice.
2. Students may be enrolled in more than one club, depending on availability. Please understand that most clubs are limited to 20-25 students maximum. If your child is not enrolled in one of their club choices, they will be placed on that club's waiting list. When space becomes available, we will contact parents and update schedules. EVERY STUDENT THAT REQUESTS A CLUB WILL GET AT LEAST ONE CLUB.
3. Competition Clubs for grades 3-8: Competition Math, Science Olympiad, VEX, and FLL coaches will determine their team rosters during the first few weeks of school. Please watch your email for any information and/or updates from the competition team coaches.
4. Some clubs require a small monetary fee to cover expenses; these fees are non-refundable. Students who have an outstanding balance on their account (lunch, aftercare, book fees, etc.) from last school year will not be allowed to attend clubs until their balance is paid in full. Additionally, students will be unable to attend clubs until all club fees are paid. Links to SchoolPay to pay these fees will be sent out AFTER your child is confirmed into the club. Please do NOT pay for a club on SchoolPay if you do not have confirmation of admittance into that club.
5. It is important that a separate Google form be filled out for each child. Please use the same email for each entry. This helps streamline the system for pushing out emails with club assignments.
6. If you submit a request for the same student more than once, the first one will be deleted. I will always assume an error was made if there are multiple entries and will therefore only use the most recent submission.
7. All club requests are due by Tuesday, August 1st, 2023, by midnight. Clubs will begin on the FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL, Thursday, August 10th. An email will be sent to families before the first day of school to let you know what club(s) your child has successfully enrolled in. You may also be able to check club assignments at Meet the Teacher on Tuesday, August 8th.
