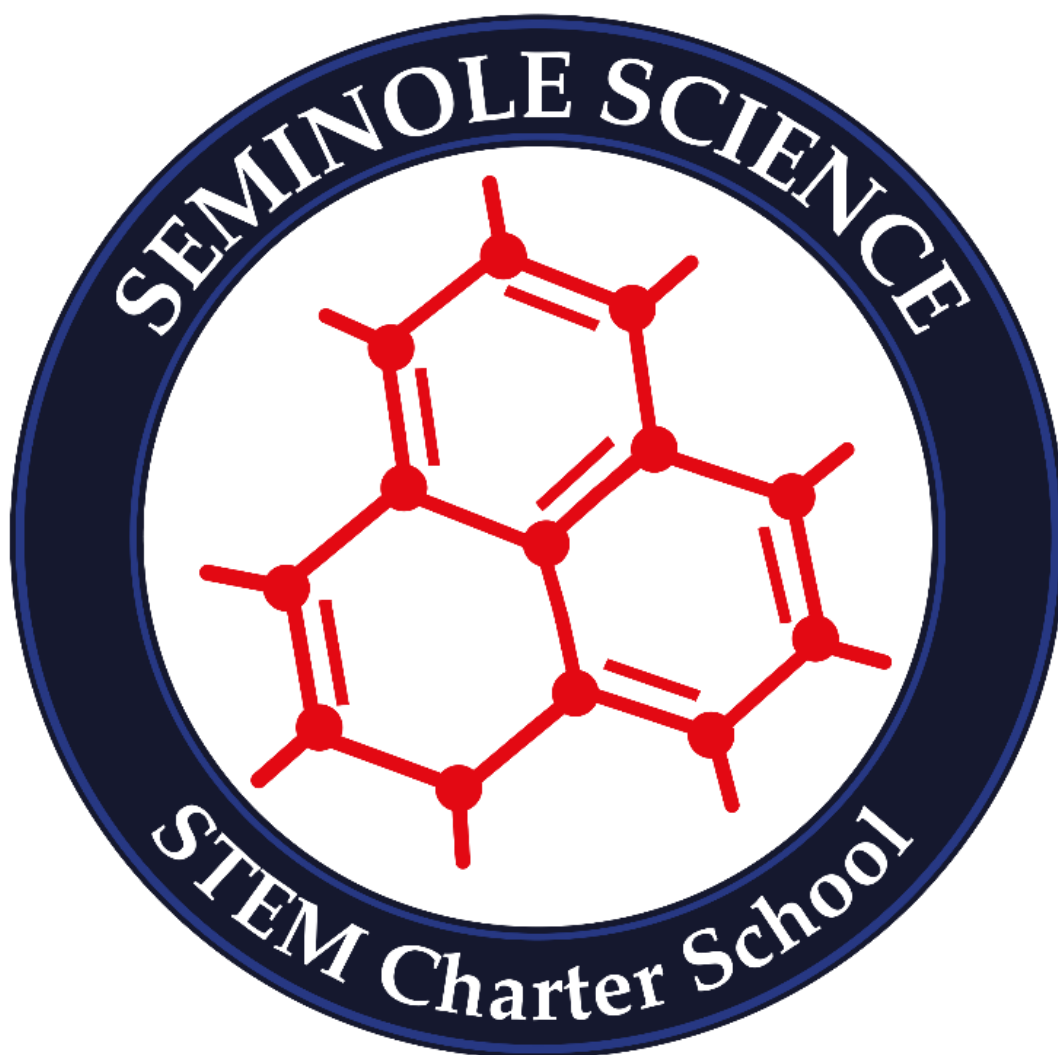

This dynamic program offers students in grades K-5 a fantastic opportunity to engage in hands-on, inquiry-based challenges across various scientific disciplines, including life science, earth/space science, physical science, inquiry, technology, and engineering. Think of it like an academic track meet, where students team up to tackle a series of engaging events, fostering critical thinking, problem-solving skills, and a love for STEM. Our school will form 2 or 3 Elementary Science Olympiad teams for the 2025-2026 school year.

To ensure students can thrive in this rigorous yet rewarding program, team selection will be based on several factors:

- **Academic Preparedness:** Students should demonstrate a solid foundation in reading with a level 3 or higher on the FAST reading and an interest in science concepts to effectively engage with the event material and handle the additional workload.
- **Behavior and Self-Discipline:** The program requires focus, dedication, and the ability to work independently and as part of a team.
- **Teamwork and Collaboration:** All ESO events are team-based, emphasizing cooperation, communication, and mutual support.
